WHAT IS MARTYN'S LAW?

Martyn's Law – formally known as the **Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Bill**– is new UK legislation designed to improve public safety by making venue operators legally responsible for protecting people from the threat of terrorism.

Named after **Martyn Hett**, a victim of the 2017 Manchester Arena attack, the law ensures that businesses and public venues take proportionate security steps to prevent, prepare for, and respond to potential attacks.

This affects thousands of public-facing venues – and introduces new legal duties that **require security products.**

REQUIREMENTS

WHO DOES IT APPLY TO?

Venues with a capacity of 200 people or more, including:

- Pubs, bars, restaurants & cafés
- Shopping centres & retail stores
- Music venues & nightclubs
- Theatres & cinemas
- Places of worship

- Sports stadiums
- Health & education facilities
- · Conference centres & exhibition halls

Martyn's Law Tiers & Requirements

Martyn's Law introduces a two-tier system based on venue capacity:

STANDARD TIER (CAPACITY: 200-799)

Applicable to premises that can reasonably expect 200-799 people at once (via occupancy, historical data, seating, tickets, etc.)

CORE REQUIREMENTS:

- Implement reasonably practicable procedures for responding to a terrorist attack
- Staff must be instructed appropriately to carry out these procedures
- Procedures include:
- Evacuation and lockdown
- Securing access/egress routes
- Identifying safe spaces
- No formal risk assessment, physical security plan, or specific anti-terrorism training mandatory.

VENUES (TYPICALLY STANDARD TIER):

- Pubs, bars, restaurants & cafés
- Theatres & smaller cinemas
- Places of worship (most)
- Small-medium education & health facilities
- Small retail stores

ENHANCED TIER (CAPACITY: 800+)

This applies to any premises or event where 800 or more people can reasonably be expected at once.

CORE REQUIREMENTS (STANDARD TIER DUTIES PLUS):

- Conduct a full terrorism risk assessment
- Produce a written security plan
- Appoint a senior security officer responsible for compliance
- Adopt physical security measures: e.g., CCTV, bag searches, secure access
- Display public-facing security documentation and signage
- Establish alert systems and coordinate response procedures

VENUES (TYPICALLY ENHANCED TIER):

- Shopping centres & large retail stores
- Music venues & large nightclubs
- Large cinemas & theatre complexes
- Sports stadiums
- Hospitals & university campuses
